

OpenCircle Scholarship Program Frequently Asked Questions

Q: I am an employee enrolled in trades school with an OpenCircle Member Company. Can I apply for an OpenCircle Scholarship?

A: No – the OpenCircle Scholarship is only available to dependent children of OpenCircle Member employees under age 25.

Q: I have been accepted into an eligible post-secondary institution for next year. Can I apply for an OpenCircle Scholarship this year?

A: To be eligible for an OpenCircle Scholarship, you must be actively attending postsecondary studies during the current scholastic window, so you would not qualify this year. However, we encourage you to apply once you start your studies.

Q: What counts as proof of enrollment?

A: Proof of enrollment is a document from your post-secondary institution that confirms that you are actively enrolled in studies for the current period and shows the school's information identifies you as the student. Examples include a confirmation of enrollment letter, a copy of your class schedule (with your information clearly visible on the class schedule), or unofficial transcripts. We do not accept: Invoices, acceptance letters, admission offers, email confirmations from the institution, or trades cards as proof of enrollment.

Q: Why do you need my Social Insurance Number (SIN)?

A: If you are awarded a scholarship, OpenCircle must report it to the CRA and issue you a T4a for the award. To do this, your SIN is required, so we cannot issue you a scholarship without your SIN. If you are uncomfortable with providing your SIN on the application form, then our team can take it verbally over the phone with you. Just include a request for our team to call you to collect your SIN when you submit your application.

Q: What if I don't have my proof of enrollment?

A: The application cannot be accepted without verification of enrollment from your educational institution. Most schools will provide a letter showing proof of enrollment, and most students have access to their class schedules online.

Q: When do I apply for the scholarship?

A: Application intake begins November 1, 2024. Application submission deadline is February 28, 2025.



Q: How do I apply for the scholarship?

A: You apply by completing the application form found on the OpenCircle website at opencircle.ca. Once completed, please email the required documents to scholarship@opencircle.ca.

Q: My spouse is an OpenCircle employee – can I apply for the scholarship?

A: The scholarship is only available to dependent children of OpenCircle employees.

Q: My post-secondary institution is not in Canada, but I live in Canada. Can I still apply for the scholarship?

A: No – the scholarships are only available to students attending a post-secondary institution in Canada.

Q: How do I know if my school is a designated educational institution?

A: Please refer to the Government of Canada's list of designated schools through Employment and Social Development Canada.

Q: I am in a trades program; can I still apply for the scholarship?

A: Yes, students enrolled in a trades program are eligible to apply for a scholarship if the applicant and school meet the eligibility criteria.

Q: Can I apply for the scholarship if I've received one before?

A: No - if you have already received an OpenCircle scholarship in the past, you cannot receive another.

Q: When will I find out if I am a recipient of the OpenCircle scholarship?

A: Successful applicants will be sent a letter and cheque in late April 2025. If you would like to check on the status of your application, please email our team at scholarship@opencircle.ca.

A: Tell us about your career goals and ambitions as well as what it would mean to you to receive this award.
